Jesus made a promise that where two or three are gathered together, in His name, He would be there. If a person has come to worship the Lord, more than likely, in his sacred quest he shall find satisfaction.

Analyze your own life. Ask yourself the question, “Have I come to worship or watch?” You can be successful in both....but only one carries the benefit of blessing.

You will never ask a more important question than this. Since the Lord saves, the answer must also be His.


1. Believe the gospel (Mk. 16:15, 16). Believe in Christ as God’s Son (Jno. 20:31).
